Booking of Parent Interviews - Be Sure You Have Completed This Important Task

Parent/Teacher Interview dates are Tuesday, Nov. 20/18 from 5:00 - 8:00 pm and Wednesday, Nov. 21/18 from 3:30 - 6:30 pm. **Booking of Interviews begins on Friday, Nov. 9/18 at 8:00 am.** Use the <u>School Interviews Link</u> to book an appointment. Once the link is open you should be able to go directly in and book your interview(s). If asked enter ACCESS CODE - **sstra**. Interview appointments for students in grade 1-7 will be 15 minutes long. ECS Student Led appointments will be 30 minutes. In Junior High parents may book interviews with individual subject teachers. Call our school office at 780-809-2996 if you are encountering any difficulties.

** Please note that depending on teaching assignment some teachers will only be available on one evening.**

Term 1 Report Cards

Report Cards for students in grade one to six **will be issued on Friday**, **Nov. 16**. Kindergarten students do not receive a Report Card in the first term. Students in grade seven will not receive a printed Report Card. Parents of students in grade seven have all been contacted regarding the setup to access PowerSchool. Marks for students in grade seven are accessed online via Powerschool. Parents can check marks daily-weekly-monthly so there is no need to send a printed Report Card home in Term 1 and 2.

Term 1 Extra Fee Payments

If your child was on a Field Trip in the first term or had some extra fees associated with some Dynamic Options you will receive a letter indicating the charges. Kindly pay by December 15, 2018. We hope that you will use School Cash Online but we will accept cash/cheque at the school office.

Staff Meeting/PD Day Nov. 9

Our teaching staff will take part in a workshop with Corrie Ziegler on Concept Based Planning and have some time to examine the new K-4 Draft Curriculum during the morning of Friday, Nov. 9th. In the afternoon we will have our regular staff meeting and our staff will do more learning related to Inquiry Based Learning. We appreciate these Fridays and thank our parents for supporting this model of PD in our District.

Cold Weather - Indoor or Outdoor Recess?

When the weather turns cold, we often have parents ask, "How cold does it need to be before you keep the students inside." Our District's Administrative Procedure clearly outlines when students should not participate in activities outside. The temperature at which outside recesses and outside activities are not permitted is when

- 1. the temperature is -20 degrees celcius or colder.
- 2. the temperature and the windchill is -20 degrees celcius or colder.

Staff and administration can also choose to keep children inside or limit the amount of time outside if, in their estimation, local conditions change quickly and make it necessary to keep students inside or bring them in when outside. Our District AP calls for us to use the Environment Canada website to gather information about weather conditions.
