Tickets will be sold for \$3 per ticket. Tickets purchased via School Cash will be sent home with the youngest child in the family on Monday, Dec. 10.

Parents are reminded that they <u>ARE NOT</u> to purchase tickets for students of SAA in K-6. Students will have a chance to see the Concert in the morning during a school wide Dress Rehearsal. During the Concert children will remain in their homeroom class where they will be involved in classroom activities. Proceeds from ticket sales will go to our music program, to alleviate costs associated with the concert and \$1 of every ticket will be used to support our Christmas Baskets for Catholic Social Services.
