The whole month and our last week before the Christmas Break has many activities for our students to think about helping and welcoming others and continue to build a culture where everyone knows one another(big and little) and that we share, laugh and come to know Christ through one another. It's been a great month!(actually it's been a great four months)

Throughout Month

<u>STOCKING STUFFER</u> - each student was asked to bring in a stocking to be hung in their class. We then encouraged each child to bring in a little stocking stuffer for the others in their class at one point before the Christmas holiday. The filled stocking will be sent home on the last day(Friday). This is the last week to have your child contribute.

<u>ADVENT TAKE JOY - KITS</u> - Families that returned Interest in Participating forms have been receiving the kits. The youngest in each family is sent home with a kit containing a small advent wreath to light, a book about the birth of Christ, a tin of cookies to share, reading/prayer for the day and a journal for families to reflect. The last week for the activity is this coming week.

<u>WELCOME BASKETS</u> - Students bring items from a suggested list of donations and we create welcome baskets for Catholic Social Services that would be distributed to refugee or immigrant families. This is part of our Global Read-ALoud Project. (baskets will be placed under the tree, donated items can be placed right in the baskets). Some of our students have been knitting scarves for these baskets. If you would like to contribute and have not been able to do so we would ask that you send your items by Thursday, December 20 as Catholic Social Services will be here to pick them up first thing on the 21st of December. <u>Welcome Basket LINK</u>.
