1. GSACRD Draft School Year Calendars - 2019/20, 2020/21

The District is asking for School Council feedback on the proposed Draft Calendars for the 2019/20 school year and the 20120/21 school year. Highlights of both draft calendars include: 179 instructional days, going from 8 Full Day PD/Staff Meeting Days to 6. Increasing Early Out Staff Meetings from 2 to 4. Background - School Council Planning
