


Students at SAA learn about First Nations, Metis and Inuit culture.

Interview slots for students in grade 2-7 will be 15 minutes long. Kindergarten and grade 1 student Led slots will be 30 minutes. In Junior High parents may book interviews with individual subject teachers.

#### School Council News

Thanks to all parents who were able to attend our March School Council Meeting. We were pleased to hear that there will be no increase to the SAA School Fees for next school year. Fees will be \$68 for grade one to Junior High. Kindergarten will have no fees unless a child is registered in Full Day Kindergarten. In that event they will need to pay the District fee and will be required to pay the Lunch Supervision fee of \$33 which all students in grade one to Junior High will pay. Mr. Lamer and Mrs. Kleparchuk reviewed many events that have happened in our school in the last month and upcoming events that will occur before our next meeting. Administration thanked parents for the excellent turn out and support of our Open House. They also asked us for feedback and suggestions for the next Open House. We were informed that GSACRD now has an approved calendar for the 2019/20 school year and the 2020/21 school year. Both these calendars will include a Fall Break. Turner reported to us about two very concerning resolutions that have been forwarded for consideration at the ASCA General Meeting later this spring. Our Council worked discussed those and reviewed each resolution and determined as a group whether we wanted to support it or not. # St. Albert Public Library

The St. Albert Public Library is once again offering the **Reading Buddies** program for children grades 2-6 who could benefit from extra practice. In a fun and relaxed setting, young readers will be paired up with a reading buddy for support and guidance. The purpose of the program is to encourage the joy of reading through various literacy-related games and activities as well as reading out loud together. We are hoping that you can ensure that your teaching staff is aware of this **free program**, so that together we can best meet the needs of children in our community.

We offer two programs. There is a program specifically for grade 2 (Reading Buddies) as well as a program for grades 2-6 (Reading Buddies Two).

# Information about the Reading Buddies programs:

- The program is intended for reluctant or struggling readers, but does not require a special diagnosis or referral.
- The grade 2 program will run Tuesdays from 4:00 to 5:00 from Apr. 9 May 14 and all the volunteers are teens.
- The grade 2-6 program will run Wednesdays from 6:30 to 7:30 from Apr. 10 May 15 and the volunteers may be teens, adults and seniors. Children may be able to read to Rufus, a hypo-allergenic Havanese therapy dog.
- Volunteers are required to give references and other information to help us create positive matches between them and their young reading buddies.
- Fun, laughter and friendships are encouraged!

If a teacher has a child in his/her classroom that could benefit from this program, could they please pass this information on to the parent so they can self-refer. Attached is a promotional poster which could be displayed on a bulletin board and/or printed and sent home. Thank you very much for helping us to link children to this positive reading experience.
