Recreation Academy Registration

Approved 2019/20 School Year Instructional Calendar

The Board of Trustees of Greater St. Albert Catholic School District has approved the GSACRD 2019/20 Instructional Calendar. SAA Legacy Project Approved

We are pleased to inform you that the Board of Trustees has approved an art project that intends to honor the namesake of newly opened schools in our District. Sister Alphonse Academy is the first of two and artists were asked to submit bids through January and February. The project that has received approval by the Board was submitted by local artist Louis Lavoie. It involves the creation of two tile murals that honor the legacy of Sister Alphonse, one that will be installed outside along the brick entryway to the school and one on the wall above the Royals room. The project has been designed so that students, staff, parents and local stakeholders will have an opportunity to contribute. Included below are two pictures of what the project might look like finished and installed. The large mosaic mural on the left entitled THE HUMBLE SEAMSTRESS (approximately 7' x 21') is custom designed to fit the desired space. The mural will depict a large vista scene portraying the progression of the Catholic school system in St Albert over the years. The mural will be comprised of over 600 mosaic tiles and will be painted by professional artists under the guidance of Lewis Lavoie and will also include outreach painting opportunities for community members, parents and every student currently attending Sister Alphonse Academy to commemorate the first year the school has been in operation. The completed mosaic tiles will highlight symbolic images of faith, the indigenous community (treaty 6), the French heritage of the Grey Nuns, education symbols (ie books, globes etc), cultivating friendships, importance of family and images of notable people such as Margaret D'Youville, Father Lacombe etc. The mural on the right is entitled TREE OF LIFE. and attempts to celebrate the miracle of life and the importance of faith. This mosaic will employ the talents of professional artists for the tiles. It appears that early in May, students, parents and other stakeholders will be invited to come to the school to paint tiles for the outside mural. The targeted completion date for the project is late August 2019, with unveiling in September of next school year.

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St. Albert Public Library

The St. Albert Public Library is once again offering the **Reading Buddies** program for children grades 2-6 who could benefit from extra practice. In a fun and relaxed setting, young readers will be paired up with a reading buddy for support and guidance. The purpose of the program is to encourage the joy of reading through various literacy-related games and activities as well as reading out loud together. We are hoping that you can ensure that your teaching staff is aware of this **free program**, so that together we can best meet the needs of children in our community.

We offer two programs. There is a program specifically for grade 2 (Reading Buddies) as well as a program for grades 2-6 (Reading Buddies Two).

Information about the Reading Buddies programs:

- The program is intended for reluctant or struggling readers, but does not require a special diagnosis or referral.
- The grade 2 program will run Tuesdays from 4:00 to 5:00 from Apr. 9 May 14 and all the volunteers are teens.
- The grade 2-6 program will run Wednesdays from 6:30 to 7:30 from Apr. 10 May 15 and the volunteers may be teens, adults and seniors. Children may be able to read to Rufus, a hypo-allergenic Havanese therapy dog.
- Volunteers are required to give references and other information to help us create positive matches between them and their young reading buddies.
- Fun, laughter and friendships are encouraged!

If a teacher has a child in his/her classroom that could benefit from this program, could they please pass this information on to the parent so they can self-refer. Attached is a promotional poster which could be displayed on a bulletin board and/or printed and sent home. Thank you very much for helping us to link children to this positive reading experience.
