#### Planning and Grade Configurations for the 2019/20 School Year

Understandably, once the month of April comes parents begin to think about the next school year and wonder about class assignments, etc. Unfortunately we have no clear sense of what our numbers will be for next school year. We have had many phone calls and we have provided many tours of our school fairly regularly since the beginning of January. We do know that almost every child currently attending SAA has indicated they expect to return and we have begun to confirm new registrations for a number of new families that will be moving into our attendance area. We have also been given permission to confirm attendance for some families out of our attendance area where space and resources permit. At this time it is far too early to predict what grade configurations will look like in September. We currently continue to accept registrations for kindergarten to grade nine for the 2019/20 school year. Our planning, as it did last year, will contain many contingencies and possibilities. The great thing is that we have highly skilled and flexible teaching staff that have experience and success at a variety of grade levels. We hope to bring on additional teaching staff that will add new talents and strengths. We will provide parents with more information as we can. #### 2019/20 School Times

Many parents have asked about school day times for next year. Although we do not have official confirmation, we do believe that our school day start and end times will be similar to this school year. Currently for students in grade one to nine we are planning for an 8:20 am entry into the school with an 8:30 am start. Lunch would occur from 12:08 to 12:55 pm. The school day would end at 2:57 pm. Kindergarten times are being finalized but we expect them to be similar to this school year.

#### **Dress Reminder**

We would like to remind all parents that there are still some cool mornings and the weather can change quickly. This requires that students still have a warm jacket for activities outside. We would also advise parents to be sure to check our school Dress Code for clothing choices in the remaining few months of school. Our School Dress Code has been endorsed by School Council. It attempts to ensure that we reflect our Catholic/Christian Faith values and has been designed to be acceptable for a wide range of ages within our school. If a student is wearing something that would not meet our Dress Code guidelines a staff member will address it with the student. This could involve putting on a sweater or changing into something more appropriate. In some cases it could involve a call home to parents.
