Planning and Grade Configurations for the 2019/20 School Year

Understandably, once the month of April comes parents begin to think about the next school year and wonder about class assignments, etc. Unfortunately we have no clear sense of what our numbers will be for next school year. We have had many phone calls and we have provided many tours of our school fairly regularly since the beginning of January. We do

know that almost every child currently attending SAA has indicated they expect to return and we started to confirm new registrations for a number of new families that will be moving into our attendance area. We have also been given permission to confirm attendance for some families out of our attendance area where space and resources permit. At this time it is far too early to predict what grade configurations will look like in September. We currently continue to accept registrations for kindergarten to grade nine for the 2019/20 school year. Our planning, as it did last year, will contain many contingencies and possibilities. The great thing is that we have highly skilled and flexible teaching staff that have experience and success at a variety of grade levels. We hope to bring on additional teaching staff that will add new talents and strengths. We will provide parents with more information as we can. Recreation Academy Registration - Reserve Your Child's Spot Now

Recreation Academy is now accepting registrations for students who were not registered in Recreation Academy last year, including students who are currently attending SAA and will be in grade four to eight next year. We plan to offer Rec. Academy to a group of students in 4-6 and a group in Junior High. Each class can only accommodate up to 23 students so it is critical that parents register early to ensure a spot. The program will run two days a week, elementary students in the morning, Junior High students in the afternoon Monday and Wednesday. If your child is currently in Rec. At our meeting members of Council decided that we will not fill the Chairperson position now. We will elect a new chairperson at the Council Organizational meeting in September when we have have elections for all positions on the executive.
