Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Exam - Part A Writing

On Wednesday morning students in grade six at SAA will join students from around the province in writing Part A of their Provincial Achievement Exam in Language Arts. Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) are administered to students in grades 6 and 9 and have three main purposes:

-to determine if students are learning what they are expected to learn;

-to report to Albertans how well students have achieved provincial standards at given points in their schooling;

-to assist schools, authorities, and the province in monitoring and improving student learning.

For most students in grade six this is the first time that they will write year end cumulative exams. In some cases it can create a bit of nervousness and anxiety for students so it's always good to talk with your kids and reassure them that these feelings are normal. Help your child by ensuring that they have a good rest the night before and come to school after having eaten a good breakfast. We have included dates of all Provincial Achievement exams for students in grade six. If you know that your child must be away from school on one of these days please contact the school and speak with Mr. Lamer. Students can write on alternate dates but there are strict rules and regulations in regards to this. Thank you for your cooperation.

School Nutrition Program

Sister Alphonse Academy is very fortunate to receive grant funds from the District to help promote healthy eating. These funds were provided by Alberta Education's School Nutrition Program. We will have access to these funds to promote healthy eating over the next two months. The purpose of the School Nutrition Program is to provide students in participating schools with access to nutritious food from each of the four food groups at no additional cost to students or their families. We have decided to use these funds to provide classroom food baskets that the students can choose to eat from throughout the day (fruit, veggies, items from the food groups), and to purchase snack items for the whole school that promote healthy eating. We choose to have the Dynamic Options Foods students in Grade 4-6 assist with the preparing of the snacks. The vision for the School Nutrition Program is to assist with education about healthy food choices. We will also educate the students about the four food groups and knowing which foods to choose more often (i.e., balanced meals, portion control) through our morning announcements.
