

SAA Bulletin #38 Friday, June 14 Take a look at some of the learning and activities that took place in our school this week!



# Registration Update

Thank you to all our parents who have completed the online registration process. At this time we are forecasting an enrolment somewhere between 155 - 170 students for next year. This would be a significant increase from the 97 students we began with in September of this school year. It's still very hard to say as we have registration inquiries and registrations being accepted regularly. We are not sure how many families could register their children after they move into the area over the summer. Class configurations, teacher assignments and class numbers are still to be determined. Now that we have registration confirmation from current SAA students we are planning for a number of scenarios. We added one more teacher who will work mainly at the Junior High level as we add grade eight to our school next year. At this time we have no registrations for grade nine. Rest assured that we will be ready to go when September comes around!

# 2019/2020 Junior High TRAVEL CLUB

We have started the process to organize a Junior High Travel Club and plan a trip to the Canadian Maritimes for the upcoming school year, tentatively in the spring of 2020. Students will travel for approximately one week with teacher supervisors and a travel guide from EF Tours to experience New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. Our next step is to determine interest from parents and students. We will be holding a family information session on June 18th in the SAA Learning Commons at 6:30pm. about this exciting opportunity. A trip like this would cost approximately \$2800 to \$3300 per student depending on final itinerary. The tentative travel date being considered is May 17 - 24. Twenty students would be required in order for the trip to move forward. All trips outside of Alberta require tentative approval from the Superintendent or designate six months in advance of the trip and require final approval two months before the intended date of the Field Trip.

Students are responsible to arrange transportation home. Students who do not have consent will stay at school and study in the Learning Commons.

## Academic Achievement for 2018/19

Honors Certificate (awarded to any student in grade 7 – 12 that meets the criteria that is outlined in District Administrative Procedure 368. This certificate is modeled after the professionally recognized criteria of the Alberta Rutherford High School Achievement Scholarship.)Presented annually to Grade 7, 8 and 9 students in GSACRD meeting the following criteria:

- a combined final course mark average of at least 80% in core courses (English Language Arts/French Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, Math)

- a final course mark of 70% or better in each of Health, Religion and Physical Education.
- must have passed all other courses

- must write all final year end exams unless a student is excused by documentation listed in an Individual Program Plan or documentation provided by a doctor.
