Enrolment Update

Last week we would have predicted an enrolment of 177 students. As of September 3/19 we have a confirmed enrolment of 173 students. Currently we have the following class configurations; KAM(22), KPM(18), Gr. 1(24), Gr. ³/₃(30), Gr. ⁴/₃(27), Gr. ³/₆(26), Gr. 7(23), Gr. 8(14)

We will be adding some staff at the grade $\frac{2}{3}$ level to provide some smaller group instruction for part of the day in a team teaching situation and possibly some staff at the grade 4-6 level for some small group instruction as well. This will take a couple of weeks to advertise and find the right staff for these positions. We will do this as quickly as we can.

What do I Need to Learn?

This year our inquiry question for all students K - 8 will be, "What do I need to learn?" This question will be discussed and woven through the school year. We will have the children reflect upon and discuss it throughout the school year and tie it into many activities throughout the year.

Formal/Spirit Wear Days

We are hoping that you will consider purchasing SAA Spirit wear for your children. If you choose not to do this we would ask that you consider having your child(ren) wear blue or green on our Formal/Spirit Wear Days. Generally, this is every Thursday during the school year but check our calendar for dates.

Entry to School

All students from K-8 must wait outside of the school until 8:15 am when the entry bell goes. Please have your child use the following entrances:

- Kindergarten, Gr. 1, Gr. 7 and Gr. 8 Main Entrance
- Gr. 2, Gr. 3, Gr. 4, Gr. 5, Gr. 6 East Entrance Near Visitor Parking Lot

Check Backpacks on Monday

As much as possible we will try to communicate with our parent community electronically. However, there are occasions that require us to send home forms or correspondence in paper. As much as possible, we will try to do this on Monday and we will try to let you know via electronic notification that you can expect something in the backpack. You may now go ahead and put in orders for special hot lunches, milk tags and lunch cards via <u>School Cash Online</u>.

SAA Spirit Wear

We have now entered into an agreement with Sportfactor to provide our school with Spirit Wear. We are hoping that parents will once again consider purchasing SAA Spirit wear for your children. If you choose not to do this we would ask that you consider having your child(ren) wear blue or green on our Formal/Spirit Wear Days. Generally, this is every Thursday during the school year but check our calendar for dates. Clothing will be ordered online and then delivered to the school. The first clothing order deadline is **September 20**. Click on the <u>Spirit Wear Link</u> to begin ordering. Click on the <u>clothing</u> inventory link to see what can be ordered.

Junior High Stuff

Parents who have students in Junior High can expect to receive information regarding Powerschool access to view student achievement and attendance at the end of September or early October. More information will be coming later on.

Students in Junior High should have brought home a parent consent form that would allow your child to leave the school property over the lunch hour. Students will need to have signed consent and check in with the office prior to leaving. Parents can choose not to provide consent if they wish. This is a privilege and it can be removed if there are any issues or returning late for classes in the afternoon.

A reminder that all students in Junior High must change for Physical Education classes. Students who are registered in Recreation Academy also have one block of Physical Education a week at the school on Friday afternoons in addition to their Rec. Academy classes on Monday and Wednesday afternoon.

Junior High Options will begin on Tuesday, September 17.

Notify the Bus Driver

We would ask you to remind your children to please notify the bus driver if they will not be riding the bus home after school. If you are picking your children up at the end of the day we would also ask you to notify the driver.

School Fees

At this time 2019/20 School Fees for students in grade 1-8 are \$68. You will receive information in the next few days about how you can pay these online through School Cash.

Snack Shack

The school operates a "Snack Shack" during the lunch hour, which consists of items that the students can purchase to supplement their lunch from home. Students in Junior High help to assist with the operation of the "Snack Shack" and students enrolled in the Enterprise & Innovation Options class will assist in the promotion and operations to begin the school year. This allows for authentic learning experiences while students gain valuable work experience. Some examples of items that are available are: instant noodle cup of soup, cheese/meat & cracker trays, veggies & dip, pizza pops, jello, chips. There are occasionally "specials" on sale which students will hear about on the morning announcements. The items cost anywhere from 50 cents to \$3. Students can pay for the concession items using cash or a "snack shack" card that can be purchased in school cash online in \$5 & \$10 denominations. Students can then use the card at the snack shack instead of bringing cash to school. Purchases amounts are then highlighted off the card until the balance is down to zero. Student's names are on the cards so they are easily identified.

There are also milk sales at the school, which are 80 cents a milk carton. A sheet of milk tickets can be ordered that includes 25 coupons for \$20, or students can pay for the milk at the snack shack. There may be days throughout the school year where milk sales may be cancelled (due to shortages, or before or after school breaks).

Hot Lunch Days are offered twice a month where students can pre-order items in advance to be delivered at their class for lunch hour. Orders must be placed through the school cash online before the order cut-off date which will be provided in the weekly bulletins. Orders cannot be taken after the cut-off date as the orders need to be placed with the vendors. Some of vendor restaurants that we will be ordering from are: Mr. Sub, Love Pizza, Booster Juice, Boston Pizza, Subway, Edo Japan, BarBurrito. There are also a few other hot lunches (Harvest Lunch, "Souper" Soup Day, Chilli Cook Off) that will be made at the school (this allows for authentic experiences where the students at all age levels get to prepare food and come together as a school community). These lunches will also be included in the hot lunch orders.

Any extra fees collected from the Snack Shack/ Hot Lunch Program will be used to offset school activities and cover additional costs associated with those unable to pay for field trip/extracurricular costs.

Snack Shack opens and milk sales begins on Monday. The hot lunch days for September and October have been added on school cash online for orders to be placed.

SAA Legacy Project Unveiling

Over 150 years ago, a legacy of teaching began in the district when the Sisters of Charity – more commonly known as the Grey Nuns – arrived in St. Albert from Lac Ste. Anne in 1863. Foundational to the Grey Nuns philosophy was a commitment to excellence and that education be a building block to community. Therefore, it was very fitting that the district honoured this 150+ legacy and the pioneering work of the Grey Nuns with the opening of Sister Alphonse Academy last September.

The story of this important legacy continues, as we gather to unveil original art that highlights the significance of Catholic education in our region. The Sister Alphonse Academy school community is not only blessed with such a rich heritage, they now have a 21st Century interpretation of this incredible legacy!

Many staff, students and community members took part in tile painting workshops for the Sister Alphonse Legacy Project. These individual contributions were then woven together into beautiful original artwork, created by local artist Lewis Lavoie and the team at Mural Mosaic. We are excited to share in the celebration of this milestone as a community, and we look forward to welcoming you to Sister Alphonse Academy on September 19.
