Students at SAA spent their lunch recess harvesting beets, carrots and tomatoes from our garden. Vegetables will be used for our "Harvest Lunch" in October.




Grade one students at SAA explore living and non-living things.

Orange Shirt Day

On Monday, September 30 we ask all students and community members to wear the color orange. The date in September for Orange Shirt day was chosen because it is the time of year when children were taken from their homes to Residential Schools and because it is an opportunity to stand for anti-racism and anti-bullying in homes, schools, communities and throughout the world. It is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools, and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

Picture Day - Icon Experience by Lifetouch

On the morning of **Tuesday**, **Oct. 1** ICON will be here to take individual student pictures. **Depending on weather pictures could be taken inside or outside.** Current forecasts call for a sunny day. Icon may use "green screen technology" so they would recommend that students DO NOT WEAR GREEN ON THIS DAY. Pictures will begin with students in kindergarten working up through the grades as the day goes on. Afternoon ECS students will have their pictures taken in the afternoon. Here are some details related to their program:

- 1. **Students will have a minimum of 3 poses** This will give parents additional pictures to choose from and photographers the ability to capture a little more of the student's personality.
- 2. **Complete Online Service** Icon is proud to say they have a user friendly program which makes ordering online much more convenient to parents and guardians. Parents can view all the poses close up, compare the poses side by side, and change the background on pictures that were taken indoors on our virtual background. Each gallery is personalized to the student and secured with an online proof code that your child will receive on picture day.
- 3. Online Order Forms Step-by-step instructions will be provided for you by students on photo day. Images will be available to view within 2-3 business days. If your child did not bring the ONLINE CODE SHEET home please call 780-449-3558 and they will be able to help you access your photos. The Icon online ordering system has a secure PCI compliant terminal and accepts, visa, mastercard, visa debit and prepaid visa/mastercard. Parents who cannot order online can call Icon Customer Service directly and they will provide an alternative ordering method.
- Family Discount Icon has updated and simplified their family discount plan 15% discount on all orders over \$75.00. This high volume plan will offer savings to everyone and not just families with multiple children. Code is: FAMILY19.

- 5. Package Delivery All portrait orders will be shipped directly home (FREE shipping period (7-10 days) then a shipping fee of \$4.95 applied approximately 10-15 business days from the order date.
- 6. SIBLING PHOTO PROGRAM In addition to the individual photography program we are pleased to offer group photography of brothers and sisters together on the same day. We will offer the sibling photos morning or lunch recess. If you are interested in Sibling Photos please check the backpack of your youngest child or go online and download the "tomorrow notice" Complete the information required and return the notice on photo day. Our photo assistants will collect these as the classes are called for individual photos and arrange for sibling groupings over lunch or recess periods so as not to disrupt class times. Please be aware that Icon offers evening sibling photos during the fall at an outdoor location in Sherwood Park. There is no added charge for your families taking advantage of this service.
