






#### Staffing Update

We are pleased to inform our parents that we have added another teacher to SAA. She will work with Mrs. Trenchard in a Team Teaching situation during the morning in our grade  $\frac{1}{2}$  classroom. This class currently has 31 students. Ms.. Kowal comes to us from the Red Deer Catholic School System where she had a number of years experience teaching at the elementary level. Mrs. Kowal will be starting at SAA early this week. We are waiting for word from District office about the possibility of additional support at the grade 4, 5 and 6 levels and we hope to know more about this soon.

#### Read In Week

October 7-11 is Read-In-Week at schools across Canada. Our students will have some members of the community here to read to various classes.

#### **Individual Picture Ordering**

Your child should have brought home an information sheet that included your Online Proof Code and ordering information. Proofs are accessed online and could be ready for viewing by Saturday, October 5 or early next week. If you place your order prior to October 14/19 you will receive free shipping. Orders placed after October 14/19 will incur a shipping charge. All orders are shipped directly to your home. If your child did not bring home an order form please contact ICON directly at 780-449-3558. Once you provide them with your child's name and school they should be able to provide you with the Online Proof Code for ordering.

Please be advised that if a student is absent on Picture Day or a parent requires a picture retake they will be taken during the morning of Friday, October 18.

#### Booking of Parent/Teacher Interviews - Be Sure You Have Completed This Important Task

Parent/Teacher Interview dates are Tuesday, Oct. 22/19 from 5:00 - 8:00 pm and Wednesday, Oct. 23/19 from 3:30 - 6:30 pm. **Booking of Interviews begins on Friday, Oct. 11/19 at 9:00 am.** Use the <u>School Interviews Link</u> to book an appointment. Once the link is open you should be able to go directly in and book your interview(s). If asked enter ACCESS CODE - **rvcu3**. Interview appointments for students in Grades 1-8 will be 10 minutes long. ECS Student Led appointments will be 30 minutes. In Junior High parents may book interviews with individual subject teachers. Call our school office at 780-809-2996 if you are encountering any difficulties. We will send out a synervoice reminder message about the booking of interviews on the 10th of October.

Report Cards for students in grade one to six will be issued after interviews on Friday, Nov. 8. Children in kindergarten DO NOT receive a Report Card in ECS during the first term so it is vital that parents attend their child's Student Led Conference. Students in Junior High do not receive a paper report card as parents may log into PowerSchool at anytime after October 7/19 to view their children's marks and attendance. Having interviews earlier in the school year can provide parents with more information about their child's start and progress sooner rather than later. Our Term 2 interview dates will occur in late February rather than late March as in the past. We will be seeking parent feedback about the change in dates for our Interviews in the spring of 2020, this will help us to plan for the 2020/21 school year.

#### **Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas**

The Category 5 Hurricane Dorian hit the Bahamas on September 1, causing extensive damage to the islands of Abaco and Grand Bahamas. Torrential rains swept away houses, buildings, and roads. More than 75,000 people were severely affected and at least 51 died. With rescuers continuing to search for survivors, and 1,300 people still missing, the number of victims is likely to increase in the coming days. Development and Peace is collaborating with its Caritas network partners to assess the considerable immediate needs on the devastated islands. Among the priorities identified are the affected families of unskilled workers, whom we will support with money to meet basic needs and with the provision of psychosocial support.
