Future Opportunities for Engagement


Following the first Faith in Our Future Community Engagement Open House (October 30, 2019), all community members are invited to review the information shared at the event and provide feedback. Click on the Faith in Our Future Link to access this information online and to provide your thoughts. Based on feedback shared through Thoughtexchange from October 1-30, we have identified the following topics and areas of interest:

- Safety (students and sites)
- Space considerations
- Impacts of change (e.g. sustaining French Immersion)
- Consultation process and transparency

In addition to these topics was a request for further face-to-face conversations regarding the Faith in Our Future proposal. To provide an opportunity to address specific areas of interest, school community table top discussions will take place in **January 2020** for the following school communities: École Father Jan, École Marie Poburan, École Secondaire Sainte Marguerite D'Youville, St. Albert Catholic High School, and St. Gabriel High School (dates to be confirmed). A second Community Engagement Open House is also scheduled for **February 13, 2020**. Further details will be shared closer to the date.
