### **Christmas Concert Ticket Information**

Tickets will be sold for \$3 per ticket and can be purchased via School Cash Online. **Tickets are on sale on Friday**, **until Nov. 29**. After Nov. 29 tickets not sold will be made available to families that would like more than 4. Proceeds from ticket sales will go to our music program, to alleviate costs associated with the concert and \$1 of every ticket will be used to support Catholic Social Services. We will start this project on Monday, December 2nd, the first week of Advent. ### Monday Advent Liturgy Gatherings

Beginning Monday, December 2 and then Monday, December 9 and 16 we will be gathering first thing in the morning as a school community to prepare our hearts for Christmas during the Advent season. Parents are welcome to join us during these short liturgies which will last about 10-15 minutes first thing every Monday morning. On all other days during December classes will have short Advent reflections and prayer to begin their day.

### SAA Spirit Wear Clothing Store


