Kindergarten students are challenged with some maker space activities in the Learning Commons. They had to try and build something with the materials provided.









At our November meeting this past week our Trustee Liaison Mr. Joe Becigneul updated us on the Faith in Our Future proposal. He summarized some of the reasons that prompted the proposal as well as feedback received this far. He also reported on the challenges that our District is facing because of the funding changes announced recently. Mr. Beicgneul outlined areas where there will be a reduction and how this could affect parents and schools depending on decisions that will be made shortly. We should hear more about these two important items in the next few days. School administration reviewed Accountability Pillar, Satisfaction Survey and Achievement Results. Our results show high satisfaction amongst our stakeholders and student achievement! Mr. Lamer and Mrs. Kleparchuk indicated that they believe our high results were achieved partly by commitment of staff and students as well as tremendous support by our parent community. At the next meeting we will briefly examine the schools Education Plan and then with this information we will be able to review our School Council 3 Year Ed. Plan. We learned that the SAA Fundraising Society is now an official entity! We were fortunate to have had three volunteers step up to be on the executive. We will hear more about this at our next meeting.
