# Christmas Concert

Please be advised that doors to the school will be opened at 6:00 pm on Monday, Dec. 16th. Parents will send their children to their classrooms and then take a seat in the school gymnasium. There is NO RESERVED SEATING. Students will be performing on an assembled 32" stage in the gymnasium. We plan on starting the concert at 6:30 pm sharp and we would expect that the concert will run about 60 - 75 minutes. We would ask all parents/family to please stay for the entire concert so that all children have the opportunity to perform for an appreciative audience. Students will stay with their class during the evening. They all have a chance to see the concert during the day. Seating is for parents and guests. Upon completion of the Concert parents will pick up their children in the classroom or at a prearranged spot.

# **Concert Parking**

Parents may park in the following areas during the concert: Visitor Parking, Bus Drop Off Zone, Passenger Drop Off Zone, residential areas around the school that do not have parking restrictions. We would very much appreciate if all families that are are close to the school would consider walking to save parking for those that need to drive.

# How Can I Have A Good Advent Season?

That's a great question! The Advent Season is a time to prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus. We also celebrate how He comes to us in both great and small ways each day and we look forward to His promise to come again in glory. The best way to prepare and motivate ourselves is to make the changes necessary to welcome Him into our hearts; to cultivate love. We are called to prepare a way for the Lord in our hearts. Are you ready to meet with God? How can I make this Advent Season a special one?

\* Strive to attend daily Mass more than usual - put the day and time of Daily Mass in your calendar! Mass is held from Tuesday to Friday at 8am at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception.

\* Go to confession - Schedule when you are going to go right now! Our Advent Penitential Service will be December 5th at 7pm and confession is held every Saturday morning from 9:30-11:00am in the Church.

- Read the daily Mass readings, even if you cannot attend Daily Mass.
- \* Read an Advent reflection each day. Advent reflection booklets are available in the church foyer.

\* Spend time in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which is held of the First Friday of every month at the Immaculate Conception Chapel.

(December 6th 8:30-5 pm)

- \* Create a prayer space in your home. Have an advent wreath and use it for daily prayer.
- \* Spend more time in silence consider turning off the radio in the car, the television, smart phone, etc.
- \* Take part in evening prayer at the Church (Vespers). Held on Dec 3, 10, 17
- \* Pray a Daily Rosary and reflect upon the Joyful Mysteries (Rosaries are available at the back of the church)
- \* Allow the Feasts and Dates of Advent to influence your daily life.
- \* Wear rose to Mass on December 14/15 for Gaudete (Rejoicing) Sunday.
- \* Look for opportunities to make the season about Jesus and not about excess gifts, food, and obligations.

\* Give to the poor and those in need If we truly love God then we will try to prepare the way for Him into our hearts and lives. We will wait for Him with the same attention and devotion that spouses have for each other and that parents

have for their children. Let us ask Him to teach us how to love as He does. Then we will see lasting change born of love in our life.

# Did you Know? What Liturgical Colors Are Used in Advent?

Particular days and certain types of celebrations can have their own colors (e.g., red for martyrs, black or white at funerals), but the normal color for Advent is violet. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal provides: The color violet or purple is used in Advent and Lent. It may also be worn in Offices and Masses for the Dead. In many places, there is a notable exception for the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday: The color rose may be used, where it is the practice, on Gaudete Sunday (Third Sunday of Advent) and on Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent)
