#### School Ski Trip to Rabbit Hill

### School Council

Thanks to all the parents who were able to attend our Council Meeting last week. The meeting began with a presentation of the BELRA(Boards Educational Leadership Recognition Award)by the Chairperson of GSACRD, Mr. Joe Beiceignal to Sister

Alphonse Academy for Very High Achievement on the 2018/19 Accountability Pillar Results. Mr. Lamer accepted the award

on behalf of all students, staff, School Council and parents of Sister Alphonse Academy. He indicated that excellent results are a reflection of the hard work and collaborative efforts of all stakeholders. Our Trustee also presented the Boards Annual School Results Report which indicates that GSACRD is one of the top three performing Boards within the province.

During the administration report Mr. Lamer highlighted changes at Sister Alphonse Academy as a result of the cost recovery plan approved by the Board of Trustees of Great St. Albert Catholic Schools on December 3, 2019. He thanked parents for their support for many excellent activities that were planned during the month of December and then highlighted some activities in January and February. Mrs. Hoskins has volunteered to provide a cookie for each student to decorate on Valentine's Day. More details to come.

We reviewed the School Education Plan and then reviewed the SAA School Council 3 Yr. Ed. Plan which is an ongoing document that supports the schools Education Plan. Mr. Lamer indicated that School Fees for the 2020/21 School Year could increase. He indicated that the Board was currently reviewing fees within our District and that more information would follow in the spring.

Our Compassionate Friends Committee provided parents information on how they can go online to support a family at SAA that is in need of a little extra help during a difficult time. Archbishop Smith has sent a message of condolence to members of Edmonton's Iranian community, which lost at least 27 members in the crash of an airplane near Tehran. "To our dear friends in the Iranian communities of Edmonton: I am writing to offer my most profound condolences and prayers, and those of the entire Catholic community of our Archdiocese, who join me in expressing deep, deep sadness for the tragic loss of life that has taken place in the plane crash near Tehran. The mind can scarcely grasp, and the heart cannot fathom, the pain that has befallen your communities and especially the families impacted by this terrible event. We join with you, with our fellow Edmontonians, and with all people of good will, in mourning the loss of these beloved members of your communities; and we offer our prayers for the repose of their souls and strength for their surviving family members in the days ahead." - A regular commitment of time - for practice and for your group's ministry schedule.

- The Archdiocesan requirements for all parish volunteers – the attendance to the Called to Protect 2.5 hour workshop and completing some forms (application, covenant of care).

If you do have a trained voice, if you sang in a school or church choir when you were young, if you have ever thought about being part of the music ministry at Mass, or if you appreciate the importance of musical leadership for public worship and believe that those who sing pray twice, please become part of one of the three new music ministry groups or choirs we are now forming in our parish!
