Booking of Parent/Teacher Interviews - Be Sure You Have Completed This Important Task

The Interview Booking Site is now open. Parent/Teacher Interview dates are Wednesday, Feb. 26/20 from 5:00 - 8:00 pm and Thursday, Feb. 27/20 from 3:30 - 6:30 pm. Use the <u>School Interviews Link</u> to book an appointment. Once the link is open you should be able to go directly in and book your interview(s). If asked, enter ACCESS CODE - **5xchb**. Interview appointments for students in Grades 2-8 will be 10 minutes long. ECS Student Led appointments and Gr. 1 demo of learning will be 30 minutes. In Junior High parents may book interviews with individual subject teachers. Call our school office at 780-809-2996 if you are encountering any difficulties. We will send out a synervoice reminder message about the booking of interviews on the 14th of February.

Report Cards for students in kindergarten to grade six will be issued prior to interviews on Friday, Feb. 21. Students in Junior High do not receive a paper report card as parents may log into PowerSchool at any time to view their children's marks and attendance.

Alberta Accountability Pillar Surveys

Every year the government of Alberta surveys parents of students in grade 4, 7 and 11 to gather information to gauge satisfaction of our stakeholders. Parents have the option to complete a paper survey or go online and complete a survey electronically. If you have a child in grade 4-8 at Sister Alphonse Academy you may receive a survey in the mail. We are hoping that you will consider completing the survey either by paper or electronically so that we can receive your feedback.

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter. Surveys were mailed out on January 13 and the last day to receive input is February 28/20.

2020/21 Kindergarten School Registration

Registration for those students who will be attending kindergarten in the 2020/21 school year is now open. Click on the <u>New Student Registration Link</u> to register your child for kindergarten next school year.

2020/21 Gr. 1- 9 School Registration

Registration for SAA students in grade 1 to 9 will open on Thursday, Feb. 27. As was last year, all registration will be done online. During the last week of February all parents who have children currently enrolled at SAA will receive an email that contains a SNAP CODE and link to register your children for the 2020/21 school year. The whole process will be completed online. You can expect to receive an email just prior to Feb. 27.

Recreation Academy Registration for 2020/21 School Year

Students who are currently in Recreation Academy should have brought home a Recreation Academy Registration Form for next school year. If your child will be enrolling in Rec. Academy next school year we need you to return the registration form and the deposit(required for securing a spot)ASAP. Students who are in Gr. 3 will be provided with a Registration form as well. If your child is not currently enrolled in Rec Academy this school year but you are interested for next school year please have them come to the office and we will provide them with a registration package.
