#### Nutrition Bites

As part of our funding for the school nutrition program we are encouraged to also focus on the education of Healthy Eating. We have been sharing healthy eating tips in the classrooms and on the morning announcements. We also want to share these healthy eating and nutrition tips with our families as well.

#### Start Your Morning Right!

Breakfast is an important meal to start the day. Eating breakfast helps your child to be more alert during the school day. In fact, kids who eat breakfast are more likely to do well in school and have a healthy body weight.

Prepare a balanced breakfast by including at least three of the four food groups from <u>Canada's Food Guide</u>. Here are some easy and quick breakfast ideas:

- Whole grain English muffin with an apple and glass of milk
- Whole wheat toast with peanut butter and a banana
- Scrambled eggs, and cheese on a whole grain wrap
- Mixed cereal with milk mix several high fibre cereals and add some fruit
- Oatmeal topped with walnuts and strawberries
- Smoothie made with fruit, yogurt and milk

If you run out of time in the morning, encourage your children to take breakfast on the go. Try to find a breakfast that works best for your family to start everyone's day off right.

#### Changes to Term 3 Dynamic and Complimentary Option Menu

As you may or may not know we received some unfortunate news in mid February that our construction/woodworking teacher Mr. Dewald had suddenly become ill. We are happy to let you know that although his condition is serious he is recovering and getting better! However, he will not be able to teach the two construction/woodworking options in Term 3 beginning on March 31. We have spent a considerable amount of time working with our Human Resources Department looking for a suitable replacement. Unfortunately due to the unique schedule and skill set required we have not been successful in finding a suitable replacement.

We have decided to move forward and will be offering a different option in its place. While this is not ideal, and we would expect that there may be some students who are understandably disappointed, we feel that this is the best solution. Students in Junior High will now be offered an Art Option to replace the Construction class in Term 3. Art is something that a number of our Junior High students have expressed an interest in. At the 4-6 level we will be offering a Create it Through Art option. We are very pleased to welcome Miss Jamie Lee Oliva to teach these classes. Jamie is a former GSACRD student who graduated in 2018 with a Bachelor of Education Degree Elementary Generalist with a minor in Music. She has been subbing in our District and has subbed at SAA on a number of occasions. She describes herself as passionate about art. Jamie has had some of her work displayed in the St. Albert Art Gallery and received an award for the highest achieving art student in her High School. Miss Oliva is extremely excited to be joining us and teaching a subject that she is passionate about and we are excited to have her join us at SAA!

Art 7/8 - In this course students will be challenged to be creative in a number of mediums including, acrylic painting, watercolor, clay sculpting, wood burning and drawing.

**Create It Through Art 4-6** - In this course students will have the opportunity to work with diverse materials to create and sculpt unique pieces of art. The primary mediums will be clay, model magic, acrylic and papier-mâché.
