#### School Calendar


The <u>2019/20 School Calendar</u> that was adopted by the Board of Trustees is still in effect. This includes all Statutory Holidays and PD/Staff Meeting Days as well as any non-instructional days for kindergarten. #### Staff Availability

As much as possible we have attempted to keep our staff available to students from 8:30 am to 3:15 pm. As we had indicated earlier, this has been a very steep learning curve for staff and we are not able to check in with each other as we would normally do at school on a daily basis. Our staff will be Meeting Online the first day of every school week from 2:30 to 3:15 pm in order to stay connected, support one another and pass on information from the Division Office. Occasionally staff members will also block off some times during the week when relevant P.D. opportunities are being presented, and we will take advantage of some opportunities during the day to support their mental health and well being. Our staff know that it is critical that they are available to students and that will continue to be our priority.

#### Online Learning Considerations

According to research one of the most important factors in your child being successful with online learning is to stay involved in your child's schoolwork. Your level of interest must remain consistent. Rather than asking your child how they are doing in school, ask them specifically about what they are doing in each subject. Ask them to tell you about something interesting that they discovered while studying or ask about a particular assignment they may have completed. Having students explain their learning to others is a great way to help students truly master the ideas and concepts they learn every day.

#### Support Staff Layoffs

Early in April the Government made an announcement that they were reducing education funding to School Boards for transportation and some services, such as substitute teachers, educational assistants, and other school based support staff to support Alberta's COVID-19 response. April 30 will be the last working days of our two Education Assistants, our Library Technician and our Food Coordinator. On behalf of all our staff, we would like to thank Mrs. Russell, Mrs. Bokenfohr, Miss Gamache and Mrs. Kovacevic for their dedicated service and passion to support our students at SAA. We wish them well and can't wait until the day when we can all gather at school; staff, students and parents once again.

Plans are being developed to redeploy certificated staff in critical areas that require support and continuity.

#### Jr. High Assessment and Reporting

Please be advised that students will continue to receive grades in the PowerSchool system during Online Learning. Parents are reminded that the number of grades and assessment updates may not be as frequent. Assessment in the online world will usually involve less summative quizzes and tests and more project, written work and one to one online questioning. You are likely to see more formative grades as well. Parents were provided with access to the Powerschool Portal in October. #### A Message From Father Ignacy

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ!

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1,3) As I write to you, the whole world is gripped by fear & uncertainty in ways that most of us have hardly known before. The challenge of the pandemic affects every person and every community. However, as we look at all of this in the context of these Holy Days, we need to remember that as followers of Jesus Christ we are the custodians of a living hope; nothing less than the firm and joyful conviction that in Jesus Christ God has already won the victory over sin, desolation, uncertainty and death. This means that as we remain sensitive to the sufferings of the world and take the same precautions as everyone else, we need not be overtaken by despair. Even more, we have a particular vocation to offer others the hope and medicine of the gospel. This is the Easter message. The one who was put to death has been raised and goes before us always. Jesus promises to be with us wherever we find ourselves.

Wherever it is that life takes God's children to, Jesus is already there. Jesus is not limited to time and space. Jesus has broken free from the bonds of death and shares life now and always with the children of God. The good news of Easter is not just a message for a single day. Even the 50-day season of Easter is not enough to contain it. The message of Easter is a message for every day of life. Not just in the extraordinary events of life, but also in the everyday ordinary things. Jesus is present to strengthen and sustain the weary with a word of hope and promise, a word of

victory over sin and death and anything that might hold God's children in captivity.

Easter is a celebration of the fullness of life offered through Christ for the sake of the whole of God's creation. The Easter message means new opportunities to live as God's children, even in a world that continues to be broken. We can see perhaps within this crisis a great opportunity to live and share the gospel. Because even if the world finds a vaccination tomorrow and all this quickly fades away, what is happening at the moment reminds us of our mortality, of the fragility of so many things we think of as secure, and opens up a space where each of us may find ourselves asking: what really matters in Life? Where is life going? Amid life's fragilities and uncertainties, where shall I place my hope? I have to say that I have found myself feeling uncertain and anxious at times when I have turned on the news and watched the spread of this pandemic. But I also have to say that my hope is in Christ. He is the one who, in sharing our life on earth, even our suffering and death, has brought us into an everlasting communion with God. Please be assured of my prayers, and please join me in praying, that the living hope we have in Christ may be our security and peace. God bless you and your loved ones in this strange but holy time.

#### **Televised Mass**

Salt + Light TV has arranged with cable companies across Canada (Rogers, Bell, Telus, Shaw Direct, Videotron) to make their service available free of charge to all subscribers until 1 May 2020. This means that anyone who subscribes to cable TV will be able to access Salt + Light TV and therefore the Daily TV Mass and Sunday TV Mass produced by the National Catholic Broadcasting Council. Also, "La Messe du jour" that is produced and televised by Salt + Light TV six days a week from the crypt at Saint Joseph Oratory in Montreal will likewise be televised on Sundays now through arrangements with the Archdiocese of Montreal. Salt + Light TV is televising the daily Mass celebrated by Pope Francis from Casa Santa Marta. This airs every morning and will be televised in both English and French.
