Online Learning End, Final Assessment and Report Card Distribution

As indicated by our School Superintendent online learning will continue until June 19 for Kindergarten and June 26 for Grade 1-12. Final Report Card marks will be based on evidence collected prior to Online Learning and during Online Learning, Teachers will be responsible for assessing a student's progress and assigning a final grade. All students who were on track to progress to the next grade will. The goal is to focus on key outcomes and prepare students as best as possible for the next grade. All Provincial Achievement Exams have been cancelled. All final school generated exams will also be cancelled this school year. Our School Division will be issuing parents their child's final Report Card on Thursday, June 25 at the end of the day electronically (email). If you or your spouse are receiving our weekly bulletin there should be no problems with the delivery of the Report Card by email. If you need to change your email address in our system please let us know as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners!

Weekly Mass Schedule

Daily Mass intentions are still being included in Masses during the COVID-19 Isolation period. Fr. Ignacy is offering Mass daily in solitude and will share the weekend Mass intentions with his fellow priests so please rest assured, the Mass intentions received by the Parish, will continue to be included as per schedule.

Televised Mass

Salt + Light TV has arranged with cable companies across Canada (Rogers, Bell, Telus, Shaw Direct, Videotron) to make their service available free of charge to all subscribers until 1 May 2020. This means that anyone who subscribes to cable TV will be able to access Salt + Light TV and therefore the Daily TV Mass and Sunday TV Mass produced by the National Catholic Broadcasting Council. Also, "La Messe du jour" that is produced and televised by Salt + Light TV six days a week from the crypt at Saint Joseph Oratory in Montreal will likewise be televised on Sundays now through arrangements with the Archdiocese of Montreal. Salt + Light TV is televising the daily Mass celebrated by Pope Francis from Casa Santa Marta. This airs every morning and will be televised in both English and French. Pandemic Protocol

The Alberta Bishops' task force is drafting a plan for the gradual reintroduction of public liturgies, taking into account the many complex factors involved. We are doing this because it is vitally important that when we invite our people back to Mass and the sacraments, we get it right. We simply cannot take chances with your health and safety or that of your staff and parishioners. Therefore, I am writing today to remind you that all the restrictions we announced in March continue to apply until such time that I advise you otherwise. These include:

-No celebrations of the Mass with any congregation present

- -No distribution of the Blessed Sacrament
- -No Baptisms, except in emergency

-Funerals or weddings must be limited to 15 or fewer attendees with no Mass

-Churches can remain open for adoration for private prayer, provided that no more than 15 people are in the church at a given time, that they observe appropriate physical distancing, and that commonly touched surfaces are regularly cleaned. -Confessions can be heard, while observing appropriate physical distancing.

-Priests can still visit persons in hospital or confined to home who requested Holy Communion, Confession or the Sacrament of the Sick, provided they follow hospital protocol and practice appropriate risk mitigation.

STAY SPIRITUALLY INVOLVED

In light of recent restrictions on our faith practices, here are some ideas or ways to continue your faith at home and while still respecting social distancing:

Prayer:

Continue your prayer life, first thing in the morning, mealtimes and before bed. All are easy ways to incorporate more prayer into your daily life.

Confession:

Fr. Joe has agreed to hear confessions on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 am until 12:00 pm (noon) and on Thursdays and Fridays from 6:00 until 9:00 pm.

Mass:

Although currently attending Mass in person is not available, we are all strongly encouraged to attend virtually.
