


SAA Bulletin #37 - June 12/20

The last SAA Theme Day will take place on Friday, June 19. On this day we are asking our students to "Dress Up" for the school day. Dresses, collared shirts and ties are welcome.



Online Learning End, Final Assessment, Report Card Distribution and Planning for Next Year

As indicated by our School Superintendent online learning will continue until June 19 for Kindergarten and June 26 for Grade 1-12. Final Report Card marks will be based on evidence collected prior to Online Learning and during Online Learning. Teachers will be responsible for assessing a student's progress and assigning a final grade. All students who were on track to progress to the next grade will. The goal is to focus on key outcomes and prepare students as best as possible for the next grade. All Provincial Achievement Exams have been cancelled. All final school generated exams will also be cancelled this school year. Because teachers need to submit their marks on June 19, in preparation for report cards, teachers will work to complete assessments and feedback prior to this date. Report cards will be issued electronically K-8 for all students on June 25. During the last week of school, June 22-26, teachers will be available to continue learning with students, while also supporting end-of-year requirements, including the return of school materials such as textbooks or technologies. At SAA we plan to collect textbooks and technology June 24 and June 25. People who have borrowed Chromebooks should now have been contacted with a time to bring in the device.

School Re-Entry Planning

Thanks to all our parents and students who participated in the GSARD Survey on Re-Entry preferences. This information will be used to help guide Division decisions to plan for three possible Re-Entry Plans for the 20-21 school year. On Wednesday, June 10 Education Minister Adriana LaGrange outlined the 3 possible scenarios:

- 1. In School classes resume(near normal operations with health measures)++Targeted Scenario
- 2. In School Classes PARTIALLY resume (with additional health measures in addition to the above)
- 3. At Home learning continues (in school classes are cancelled)

The government has indicated that the preferred and likely scenario is that students will return to daily in-school classes at the beginning of the year. The government will share it's final decision by August 1 on which scenario will be in place at the beginning of the year. Now that we have been provided with guidelines for these three scenarios our School Division is working on plans to implement any of the three possibilities. <u>St. Albert Parish News</u> Message from Father Ignacy

If there is one doctrine, which most defines what it means to be a Christian, it is the doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity. It is so central to our beliefs that we baptize in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Before every prayer, or when we enter into a church and bless ourselves with the holy water, we mark ourselves with the sign of the cross praying in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. To be a Christian, in essence, is to profess belief in One God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Since this belief is at the root of our identity as Christians, it is important that we have some understanding of it, even though it will always be beyond our grasp to have a full understanding of this mystery. Of course, our heads can begin to spin when we try to make sense of this great mystery. We can say that God is eternal. He has no end and no beginning. God is also all-powerful. There is nothing He cannot do. To say that all the persons of the Holy Trinity share in the nature of God is to say that whatever can be said about God can be said about the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. All of them are equally God. But simply put, God is love. Our God is not some distant Being. No. In His essence, God is a Being who is constantly loving.

We read in the gospel why Jesus came into the world: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." As complicated as we may sometimes make the matter, it all comes down to this. The God who is love loves us. And He wants us to love Him in return. The God of love wants us to know everything about Him so that our human minds can understand so that we can love Him. It is as simple as that.

Just as God has poured Himself out in love for us, so we should do the same for one another.

COVID 19 Update

Sacraments, Retreats, Parish meetings, Social gatherings and Parish related events are still on hold until further notice but Masses have started as of Friday, 5 June. Parishioners who want to attend mass must register by calling the Parish Office as only 50 people are allowed to be in the Church at one time.

Televised Mass

Salt + Light TV has arranged with cable companies across Canada (Rogers, Bell, Telus, Shaw Direct, Videotron) to make their service available free of charge to all subscribers until 1 May 2020. This means that anyone who subscribes to cable TV will be able to access Salt + Light TV and therefore the Daily TV Mass and Sunday TV Mass produced by the National Catholic Broadcasting Council. Also, "La Messe du jour" that is produced and televised by Salt + Light TV six days a week from the crypt at Saint Joseph Oratory in Montreal will likewise be televised on Sundays now through arrangements with the Archdiocese of Montreal. Salt + Light TV is televising the daily Mass celebrated by Pope Francis from Casa Santa Marta. This airs every morning and will be televised in both English and French.
