#### Last Day of Online Learning Activities Gr. 1-8 - Friday, June 26

The last week of online learning will be a bit different from the past 12 weeks. There will be some general learning activities and/or choice boards that will be posted that kids can work on throughout the week. The last official day of school for the 2019/20 school year is June 26, 2020.

#### **IMPORTANT Final Report Cards - PLEASE REVIEW**

All Final K-8 Report Cards will be sent out via email on Thursday, June 25. Each report card is password protected. To open the report card you must be able to provide your child's birthdate. If you have not received your child's report card by Friday, June 26 at noon please call the school or email Mr. Lamer or Mrs. Kleparchuk.

#### We remind parents of the following:

As per guidelines established by Alberta Education for Online Learning every student will receive final grades and will receive a report card, appropriate to their grade level. Teachers were responsible for assessing a student's progress and assigning a final grade as best they can during Term 3. All students who were on track to progress to the next grade will. The goal was to focus on key outcomes and prepare students as best as possible for the next grade.

#### What will the Kindergarten report card look like?

Your child will receive a report card that reflects your child's skill level on the Kindergarten Program Statement, using the following descriptors. The teacher will report on and focus on Literacy and Numeracy.

SI - Consistently demonstrates the skill independently.

SM - Skill is emerging with minimal support.

SD - Skill is emerging with direct support

N/A - No assessment possible.

#### What will the Gr. 1-3 report card look like?

Your child's report card will include Religion, English Language Arts, French Language Arts (French Immersion), Math, and a General Comment. Your child will receive a grade of 1 to 4 for one to three outcomes in these subjects: ELA, FLA, and Math. Your child will receive "Meets or Not Yet Meets" for Religion. All other subject areas will not be visible on the report card. Growth As A Learner" will not be graded on the report card for term three. In some cases you may see N/A, which would indicate that not enough information was able to be gathered for the teacher to make an assessment.

# What will the Gr. 4-6 report card look like?

Your child's report card will include Religion, English Language Arts, French Language Arts (French Immersion), Math, Social, and Science, and a General Comment. Your child will receive a grade on a 1-4 scale for one to three outcomes in English Language Arts, French Language Arts (French Immersion), Math, Social, Science, and a General Comment. Your child will receive "Meets or Not Yet Meets" for Religion. Growth As A Learner" will not be graded on the report card for term three. In some cases you may see N/A, which would indicate that not enough information was able to be gathered for the teacher to make an assessment.

#### What will the Gr. 7-9 report card look like?

Your child will get a report card that has Religion, English Language Arts, French Language Arts (if your child is in French Immersion), Math, Social, Science, Physical Education and Health. Teachers were not required to assess options and there were no options delivered in Term 3. When there is enough evidence for the teacher to assess your child's performance on outcomes since the start of the pandemic, your child will receive a grade percentage (%). If your child has not been able to complete enough evidence during Term 3 the teacher will input N/A, then your child will receive the grade that he/she had earned at the start of the online learning journey.

#### Honours Certificates - Jr. High

Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools recognizes student achievement in various ways, including a Division Academic Honours Certificate for grades 7-12 students. This certificate is modelled after the professionally recognized criteria of the Alberta Rutherford High School Achievement Scholarship.

Grades 7, 8 and 9 Academic Honour Certificates shall be presented annually to Grade 7, 8 and 9 students achieving a combined average of at least 80% in core courses (English language arts/French language arts, social studies, science, math), and a student must also achieve 70% or better in each of health, religion and physical education. To be eligible for honours, students also must have passed all other courses.

Students in Junior High at SAA who have achieved Honors will have their certificates mailed to their home address on June 29/20.

Parents that have children in Grade 6 are reminded that there will be an Online Gr. 6 Farewell will take place on Monday, June 22 at 10:00 am. Mr. Brass will be sending information to grade six students and parents.

# Registration and Enrollment Update

We estimate that our enrollment could be anywhere between 210 - 225 students for the 2020/21 school year. We are not sure how many families could register their children over the summer. <u>Class configurations</u>, teacher assignments and class numbers are still to be determined. We continue to tentatively plan for a number of scenarios. Rest assured that we will be ready to go when August 31/20 comes around! If new neighbors are asking, our office will be open and ready to accept registration inquiries starting August 18, 2020. You can also direct your neighbors to the Division website where they can begin the registration process online at any time.

#### Full Day Kindergarten Update

We are pleased to announce that we have been given approval for our Full Day Kindergarten Program at SAA for the 20/21 school year! This approval is provided pending that the Government implements Scenario#1- In-School Classes Resume (near normal operations with health measures, see below).

We continue to accept registrations at the kindergarten level for AM Half Day, PM Half Day, Progressive or Full Day Programming. Call the school for more information or visit our school website for more information about our kindergarten programming.

#### 2020/21 School Re-Entry Planning

Thanks to all our parents and students who participated in the GSARD Survey on Re-Entry preferences. This information will be used to help guide Division decisions to plan for three possible Re-Entry Plans for the 20-21 school year. On Wednesday, June 10 Education Minister Adriana LaGrange outlined the 3 possible scenarios:

- 1. In School classes resume(near normal operations with health measures)++Targeted Scenario
- 2. In School Classes PARTIALLY resume (with additional health measures in addition to the above)
- 3. At Home learning continues (in school classes are cancelled)

The government has indicated that the preferred and likely scenario is that students will return to daily in-school classes at the beginning of the year. The government will share it's final decision by August 1 on which scenario will be in place at the beginning of the year. Now that we have been provided with guidelines for these three scenarios our School Division is working on plans to implement any of the three possibilities. ## Message from Father Ignacy

The New Testament witnesses to many miracles which Jesus performed. He showed His control over nature by walking on water. He showed His power over sickness by curing the ill. And He showed His authority over death by raising the dead. When we think of miracles, we often consider them as a phenomenon of the past. They took place in Jesus' day and in the

early Church, but they do not happen today. With our knowledge of science and our advanced technologies is there still room for belief in miracles? Can we still believe that God bends the rules of nature to give His people a sign that He is still alive and active among us? Those of us who have the gift of faith can say without a doubt that God still performs miracles. And we do not have to look too far back into the past to find them. It is good for us modern women and men to study these miracles and learn about them. They remind us that there is more going on in our world than what we can see with our eyes or examine under a microscope. They assure us that God is at work in our world even despite its skepticism and lack of faith. We see the hand of God even in the most ordinary events of our lives - the sunrise, the budding trees, the birth of a child or the love of our family. We witness His power when enemies become friends, when hardened hearts welcome God's mercy and when our prayers are mysteriously answered. The work of God is all around us. Where others see coincidences or luck, we see our God at work.

And in no other instance is that truer than in the gift of the Eucharist. When we offer the bread and wine and the priest repeats Christ's words over them, "This is my body. This is my blood." They are really and truly transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Throughout the ages, Christians have believed that they are not merely symbols but the real thing - Jesus Christ made present for us. Just as the Holy Spirit transforms simple bread and wine, so we should expect that we who receive the Body and Blood of Christ should ourselves be transformed. Let us pray for the grace to adore Him more and more. And let us pray that when we receive Him we will be changed forever.

#### **COVID 19 Update**

Sacraments, Retreats, Parish meetings, Social gatherings and Parish related events are still on hold until further notice but Masses have started as of Friday, 5 June. Parishioners who want to attend mass must register by calling the Parish Office as only 50 people are allowed to be in the Church at one time.

#### **Televised Mass**

Salt + Light TV has arranged with cable companies across Canada (Rogers, Bell, Telus, Shaw Direct, Videotron) to make their service available free of charge to all subscribers until 1 May 2020. This means that anyone who subscribes to cable TV will be able to access Salt + Light TV and therefore the Daily TV Mass and Sunday TV Mass produced by the National Catholic Broadcasting Council. Also, "La Messe du jour" that is produced and televised by Salt + Light TV six days a week from the crypt at Saint Joseph Oratory in Montreal will likewise be televised on Sundays now through arrangements with the Archdiocese of Montreal. Salt + Light TV is televising the daily Mass celebrated by Pope Francis from Casa Santa Marta. This airs every morning and will be televised in both English and French. # **FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE:**

The Catholic Bishops of Alberta are welcoming the news that attendance limits on worship services will be expanded under Stage 2 of the Alberta government's relaunch strategy. However, the guidelines for Stage 1 of reintroducing public celebrations of the Mass were developed by a task force the Bishops established under the direction of Archbishop Richard Smith of Edmonton and Bishop William McGrattan of Calgary. Until further notice, those guidelines remain in effect. Under those guidelines, parishes will still have to meet several conditions for public celebrations of the Mass. These include:

- Ensuring physical distancing of two metres between people who are not of the same household.
- Asking attendees to answer a series of health and travel-related questions, as recommended by AHS.
- Recording contact information of attendees for the purpose of contact tracing, if necessary.
- Sanitizing hands upon entry and exit.
- Requiring masks for all volunteers and all those who wish to receive Communion.
- Extra cleaning of the Church between Masses.

THERE IS STILL A MAXIMUM OF 50 PEOPLE IN THE CHURCH, INCLUDING ALL VOLUNTEERS AND THE PRIEST.

With Masses beginning, we have a very willing parishioner making masks. If this is something you would be interested in buying, please call the parish office to be added to the list. Once your masks are completed, you will be contacted for their pickup and can make payment through the office. Masks are \$10 each. All money collected will be donated back to the parish.
