


## Take a look at some of the learning that took place last week in our school!

### Daily Health & Safety Protocol Information:

• Before coming to school each day, all staff and students must complete the Alberta government's <u>COVID-19 Information Screening Questionnaire</u>, which is available in <u>multiple languages</u>, to determine whether they **can attend or must stay home**. The form does not need to be submitted to the office. If your child has any symptoms, contact your school office to let your child's school know. Everyone who enters a school will see a sign that reminds them to complete the daily COVID-19 Information Screening Questionnaire before entering the building.



#### Important Message for Online Learners and Bus Transportation:

Please note that if your son/daughter is participating in online learning and **does not require bus** transportation, a bus **cancellation form must be filled out** through the <u>Transportation parent</u> <u>portal</u> - online forms and requests. Without this cancellation form being submitted, the fees will still be applied.

## **Emergency Evacuation Drills**

We will begin practicing our emergency procedures over the next two weeks (weather permitting). We will always notify our students that we are running a drill. As per District Administrative and Hour Zero Emergency Procedure we shall complete Emergency Evacuation drills(Fire Drills), Lockdown, On-Alert, Hold-Secure, and Shelter-In-Place drills during the year. Our Evacuation drills will still be meeting COVID-19 School Re-Entry Plan requirements:

Students in grades 4-12 should wear masks.

- It is recommended that students in K-3 wear masks for evacuation drills, although it is not mandatory at this time.
- Drills may be conducted in a variety of ways to incorporate physical distancing such as in small groups using various exits or one class at a time.
- It is critical to ensure students are familiar with the proper exit to use and the proper exiting procedures and gathering procedures.
- LIVE EVACUATION: Should a live evacuation be required, student safety should take precedence and physical distancing would be of secondary importance.
- Physical distancing can be planned at the prescribed meeting place following an evacuation drill.

If you require more information about our emergency procedures, please do not hesitate to call the school.

## Protocol for when students become ill at school:



As part of keeping students and staff safe, office staff will be donning Personal Protective Equipment when caring for a child who may become sick during the school day. Office staff will ask the student about the symptoms they are having, will take their temperature and ask them to stay in the infirmary (isolation room) until the parent arrives to pick the student up. To have students become familiar with this procedure, Mrs. Kleparchuk visited classes to show the students what to expect and what the PPE looks like so that they are at ease and will be more familiar with the safety protocols in place.

#### **Severe Medical Conditions**

Please ensure that you have updated and reported all information required if you have a child that has severe medical conditions including Anaphylaxis or life threatening allergies. District administrative procedures require students who are old enough (6-8) carry their ep-pens on their person. Where students are not old enough an epi-pen would be provided to the office and a plan developed with parents to ensure that the epi-pen is available and administrable. The administration of prescription medication should be done at home by parents, However, in the event that circumstances require the administration of medication during the day it is done at the office and requires parent consent be completed.

### Severe Allergens - No Peanut or Nuts

Some children or staff members may have severe allergies to peanuts and nut products. Please be sure not to send these products or food containing nuts to school. Thank you.

## Safe Arrival (School Messenger) - Student Absence Reporting

At Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools we use the Safe Arrival absence reporting process to support families in having their children arrive safely to school. This system will make it easier for you to report, and respond to, school absences for your child. The system also integrates with our notification system, School Messenger. The **student absence reporting system** will allow the school to verify student attendance, and quickly notify parents and guardians of absences that were unexpected or unplanned. **Report your child's absence in advance with 3 convenient methods:** On a mobile device, install the <u>District App</u> (search "Greater St. Albert Schools" in the Apple App or Google Play stores).

Select SafeArrival à Attendance à Report an Absence. (Please note, to sign up for the School Messenger SafeArrival it is best to use a computer)

- 1. On the <u>SafeArrival website</u>, <u>go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>.
- Sign Up to create your account, then select Attendance followed by Report an Absence.
- 1. <u>Call the toll-free number 1-844-818-9908</u> to report an absence using the automated phone system.

### SAA School APP

The SAA App for iOS and android is available. Just search for "My School Day" on the app store. When you run it, it will guide you through selecting Sister Alphonse Academy- this only needs to be done once. The app will be used to send out news and notifications from our school.

#### Kind Reminder - Lunches & Water Bottles:

Students please bring a water bottle to school as the fountain is not open to drink water without one at this time. Also, students may want to bring a few extra snacks to school if they find they are a bit more hungry as we do not have the milk program or Snack Shack available at this time. Thank you!
