Daily Health & Safety Protocol Information:

Before coming to school each day, all staff and students must complete the Alberta government's <u>COVID-19 Information Screening Questionnaire</u>, which is available in <u>multiple languages</u>, to determine whether they **can attend or must stay home**. The form does not need to be submitted to the office. If your child has any symptoms, contact your school office to let your child's school know.

Homework and Isolating at home:

My child is experiencing symptoms that require him/her to isolate at home for more than one or two days, what should I do?

Grades 4 - 9 teachers are asking students to go daily to their Google classroom to see what they missed, what assignments they are able to work on. Assignments and information is posted there on a continual basis. Teachers will do check ins with students to ensure they are learning the concepts that are associated with the assignments while they are away. Teachers in the early elementary grades are working on slideshows for parents which will have activities for students to do depending upon their grade level. Again, teachers will provide checks in understanding of the concepts that are being taught. Thank you to all of the parents/guardians for supporting the stay at home protocol when your children are not feeling well.
