Our Priorities

- 3. Providing even more opportunities for students to take on leadership in planning Social Justice and community service that support Catholic social teachings; to provide opportunities for everyone in the community to model a life of service achievement and aspiration.

Our Results



Celebrating Accountability Results:

- 98.1% of parents agree that teachers at SAA use different ways to help students learn.
- 100% of parents agree that staff at SAA help students learn to the best of their abilities.
- 98.1% of parents agree that staff at SAA teach for conceptual understanding.
- 96.2% of parents agree that students receive ongoing feedback to improve.
- 96.2% of parents agree that students at SAA learn about wellbeing and healthy living.
- 92.2% of parents agree that programming choices such as academy, achievement, dual credit, English/French are offered at SAA.
- 100% of parents are confident that SAA is overall a good school.

Student Strengths:

Students follow the SAA School code of conduct to reflect positive engagement and expectations which align with our school motto to **SERVE**, **ACHIEVE AND ASPIRE**.

Hope:

- 88.7 % of students agree that they participate in a faith-infused curriculum, including religious education, to develop and promote faith, hope and engagement at school.

- 88.1% of students receive ongoing feedback to improve.
