4A got into the Christmas spirit this week!















Jr. High Classes were treated to a movie and snacks by the Friends of SAA. The *Red One* was a hit! Thank you:)
















Welcome Mrs. Perkins

COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

In 2023, a small study asked students in Grades 6-10 in four schools:

- Put up your hand if you've ever seen something really scary on the internet without meaning to- maybe a car crash, an explosion, a horror movie clip/image. (100%)
- Put up your hand if you've ever seen something really hurtful on the internet about a stranger without meaning to- maybe making fun of someone's appearance, making fun of a disability. (100%)
- Put up your hand if you've ever seen something really hurtful on the internet about someone you know in real life (a classmate, a friend, a relative.) (65%)





Our students are growing up in a digital world where they can encounter scary or confusing content online. It's important to keep open lines of communication so they feel safe discussing these experiences. When students see something troubling, they might feel anxious or unsure about how to process it. By letting them know they can talk without judgment or fear of getting in trouble, we create a supportive space for understanding and reassurance. Ask open-ended questions like, "How did that make you feel?" or "What do you think about what you saw?" These conversations help them feel heard, guide them toward critical thinking, and provide the security they need to navigate the online world confidently. Let's empower our kids by being present, listening, and helping them make sense of the digital world together. As you can see from a small study in 2023 this is quite a prevalent issue for our youth.















