



5 Phrases Your Child Can Use to Stand Up for Themselves

Are you looking for ways to empower your child to stand up for themselves in different situations?

By teaching them a few simple phrases, you can make a big difference in how confident your child feels!

Here are five phrases your child can use to assert themselves and set boundaries:

- "I need you to stop bothering me and leave me alone."
 Your child will show...
 They have the confidence to stop the unacceptable behavior.
- "I don't like being called that. I want you to call me by my name." Your child will show... They expect others to be respectful and they do not tolerate verbal abuse.
- "I didn't have control over that. It's not okay to blame me.
 Your child will show...
 Theu will not be the scapegoat and they expect others to be accountable.
- 4. "I see that you're unhappy. But I can't let you treat me like this." Your child will show... They know how to advocate for themselves and set boundaries.
- "That's not safe. I'm getting someone to help." Your child will show... Theu aren't afraid to ask for help.



And most importantly:

Encourage them to stand up for themselves at home. Teach them that NO is an acceptable answer by allowing them to use it with you. Respect their boundaries. If they don't want hugs or tickles, say, "Your body, your rules

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Being assertive doesn't mean being rude or bossy—it means using your voice in a calm, confident way to stand up for yourself and others. Sometimes, being assertive can look like stopping gossip before it spreads by saying something like, "Let's not talk about people who aren't here." Other times, it might mean speaking up for a friend by saying, "That's not true about them," or "I don't think that's fair." Using assertive phrases shows respect for yourself and others while helping create a safer, kinder school environment. It takes courage, but even a small sentence can make a big difference.

This last week students in grade 2-5 finished The Empathy Project: It consisted of 6 monthly sessions. These sessions were structured for different developmental levels, each tied into the overarching theme of empathy.

• My Story: Grades 2 and 3 this stream focused on giving students an understanding of their own emotions and perspective and how this relates to others.

• Our Story: Grades 4 and 5, this stream incorporates ideas from the My Story stream and widens the focus to larger groups—their school, their community, and the wider world.
