



This feeling is uncomfortable. But it will pass.

It's not that great right now, but it's not the worst thing either.

Not everything will go my way, but I can be flexible.

One of the most powerful skills we can teach our children is how to reframe their thoughts-to shift from fear and doubt toward strength and possibility. Life is full of uncertainty, and kids feel this just as much as adults. Reframing isn't about ignoring tough feelings, but about speaking to ourselves in a way that builds courage. For example, changing "I can't do this" to "This is hard, but I can take it one step at a time," or "What if everything goes wrong?" to "I don't know what the future holds, but I know I can do hard things." The way we think shapes how we feel and act. When kids learn to reframe, they face challenges with a calmer mind and greater confidence. We can support them by modeling this ourselves and gently guiding their self-talk toward hope and resilience.

REDress Day

Red Dress Day is recognized across Canada on May 5th to honour and remember Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls. It is a time to reflect on the lives that have been lost or are missing, and to stand together in raising awareness about the ongoing violence faced by Indigenous women in communities.

The day stems from the National Inquiry launched in 2016 by the Government of Canada, which aimed to better understand the root causes of this crisis and to recommend meaningful actions for change. The red dress has become a powerful symbol of those who are missing and those we've lost. The colour red was chosen because many Indigenous cultures believe it is the only colour spirits can see, calling them back home and helping us to remember.

We invite all students and staff to wear red on Monday, May 5th, as a sign of solidarity and remembrance. Thank you for supporting this important day of awareness and reflection.

There is not age requirements for this, if you feel your kids can benefit they are welcome. If you require any more information please let me know and I will get back to you.






