COUNSELLOR'S CORNER







One of the most powerful things we can teach young people is how to take responsibility for their actions. Accountability is a skill that builds character, resilience, and emotional maturity. Like any skill, it takes practice, support, and guidance. In the school setting, we often see situations where a student makes a poor choice, but the full story includes hurt feelings, peer conflict, or misunderstandings. Both realities can exist at the same time. A child might have been treated unfairly and still reacted in a way that caused harm. Helping kids understand that their response matters, no matter what came before, is essential. When we step in to explore their choices with curiosity rather than blame, we create space for learning and growth. Shifting the conversation from "Who started it?" to "What did you do next?" encourages students to reflect, take ownership, and consider how they might respond differently in the future. It is not about punishment. It is about helping them understand that even when life feels unfair, they are still responsible for the choices they make. This is how we raise thoughtful, self-aware individuals who are capable of making things right when they get it wrong.


