

# **COUNSELLOR'S CORNER**





### Teaching Your Child to Manage ⇒ Screen Time Independently €

When your child seems to want a lot of screen time, it's important to start good habits early. Here's how you can empower your child to manage their own screen time effectively:

#### Talk About Our Limited Time:

Sit down with your child and discuss how much time they spend on screens. Make a list together of other fun things they like to do. Help them see that too much screen time can take away from these other activities.

#### **Discuss Screen Influence:**

Explain to your child that apps, websites, and shows are made to keep them interested. Tell them how these companies make money when they use their stuff a lot. This can help them make smarter choices.

#### Set Limits Together:



Ask your child how much screen time they think is fair each day. Let them help decide the limit. They might surprise you and suggest a good balance!

#### Use Tools:

Decide together how you'll keep track of screen time, like using a timer or a separate tracker. If they have trouble sticking to the limit, talk about it again. This helps them understand that this topic can be ongoing until you find a solution that works for both sides.

#### **Encourage Independence:**

As they get older, let your child be in charge of their screen time. When the time is up, trust them to stop without reminders. This helps them learn to be responsible.

By involving your child in these decisions, you teach them important skills like managing time and setting limits. They'll learn to balance screen time with other activities to create healthier habits for the future.

Screens are part of everyday life for our kids at school, at home, and socially. While technology can be a great tool, it is important we help children build awareness around how it affects them.

Rather than just limiting screen time, try asking questions like, "How does this make you feel?" or "Are you more calm or more anxious after?" Helping kids notice their emotional and physical reactions teaches healthy tech habits that last.

Technology is not going away, but when we teach our children to be open and aware, we set them up for lifelong well-being in a digital world.

# How well can your child see?

### It's important to do before they start school!

#### Eye See...Eye Learn™

is a program that provides kindergarten-aged students with a comprehensive eye exam from an optometrist. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. If required, kindergarten-aged students also receive a free pair of eyeglasses.

### How kindergarten-aged students participate

Step 1 Parents can find a participating optometrist at optometrists.ab.ca. Click on Find an Optometrist and Eye See...Eye Learn<sup>™</sup>, then enter your postal code to find a doctor close to you. Call and book an appointment.

Step 2 See your optometrist for the eye exam. Have your health card ready. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19.

Step 3 If required, kindergarten-aged students will receive a free pair of eyeglasses. Ask to see the frame selection available. The optometrist will order your glasses for you.

\*Free glasses are covered by a one year manufacturer's warranty.

#### Who can participate?

**Eye See...Eye Learn**<sup>™</sup> is available to all **kindergarten-aged students** in Alberta. It's important to address eye health and vision problems before children begin school.

Children are eligible from August until they begin grade one.

#### Eye exam coverage

There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. It's a painless, non-invasive process that could change their lives!

#### **Did you know?**

- 80% of learning is visual
- 1 in 4 school-aged children has a vision problem.

- An eye exam detects health problems such as crossed eyes or lazy eye.
- Children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed as having learning or behavioural disabilities.
- The earlier an eye health or visual problem is identified, the more likely it can be corrected.
- Children often don't know they have a vision problem, as they believe what they are seeing is normal.
- It is not uncommon for parents to believe they would know if their child has a vision problem, because these issues can be hard to spot particularly if there is a problem in only one of the eyes.

#### What is an optometrist?

Your optometrist (doctor of optometry) is a primary source for all your vision, eye health and eyewear needs. They have the knowledge, tools and equipment necessary to diagnose, treat, prescribe medications or refer to a specialist, if needed. We are updating our online payment system to better serve you. As part of this change, any previously saved credit card information in Rycor has been securely removed.

You may see a message prompting you to re-enter your card details when making your next payment. This is simply part of the update and not due to any security issue or fraudulent activity.


